#### CLB 4: Métis and Inuit

In Canada the term Aboriginal People refers to three distinct groups:

- **Indian** refers to all Aboriginal people who are not Métis or Inuit. Now we use the term **First Nations** instead of Indian. About half of First Nations people live in on reserve land.
- The **Inuit** live in small communities across the Arctic.
- The **Métis** are a distinct people of mixed Aboriginal and European ancestry. Most of them live in the Prairie provinces.
